## Our context's need

Across Ireland, north and south, Christians face profound challenges.

Moral attitudes and related laws are changing rapidly.

Christianity is increasingly rejected as a toxic relic of a troubled past.

Many believers lack confidence to share their faith and clarity about making godly decisions.

Church leaders often feel ill-equipped to guide their congregations through cultural complexity.

But Christ is still the answer to people's needs.

Churches and individual Christians need help to respond faithfully and wisely. Few Christian voices speak clearly and compassionately from a biblical perspective and deep roots in the Irish context. We need to explain Christianity truthfully in media outlets and everyday conversations. We need to engage the issues of the day with deep understanding and compassion. We need to equip Christians to live all of life for Christ's glory and share their faith with confidence.

## **Our values**


Honour everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the emperor.

We affirm the core beliefs of the Christian faith (we subscribe to the <u>Statement of Faith of the World Evangelical Alliance</u>) and work within four values based on 1 Peter 2 verse 17:

- **Fearing God** as servants of God, we aim for absolute truthfulness in everything we say and integrity in all we do, integrating insights from quality scientific and sociological research with biblical truth.
- **Honouring the authorities** we seek proper permission to work in any context into which we are invited and aim to help people in authority in the Church and in the world to fulfil their responsibilities well.
- **Honouring everyone** since every person is created and loved by God, we aim to relate to everyone, irrespective of their beliefs, with truth (honesty and transparency) and grace (humility and sensitivity).
- Loving the family of believers as diversely gifted people from different denominational backgrounds united in God's love, we work collaboratively and inclusively with all individuals, churches or organisations that share our core beliefs and values.

The implications of these values, as explained in 1 Peter, are developed by our Executive Director, Dr Paul Coulter, in his book *Honour, Fear, and Love:* The Shape of Christian Faithfulness in a Post-Christian Society, which we co-published in 2025. It is available to purchase through Amazon.


# Engaging issues thoughtfully

## Our reach

Between January 2023 and June 2025, we delivered in-person evangelistic talks, training seminars and Bible teaching to an estimated

#### 8,000 people

at events organised by

#### 27 churches, organisations and conferences

including churches from various denominations – Anglican, Baptist, Brethren, Elim Pentecostal, Methodist, Presbyterian and independent –

## across Ireland and in 8 other countries

Albania, England, Macedonia, Malaysia, Poland, Romania, Sweden and Switzerland.

In the same period, our online articles had over

#### 5,000 reads

and our online videos had over

#### 69,000 views

with the God New Evidence videos being watched for

#### 2.700 hours

and the channel adding

#### 388 new subscribers.

For all this we thank God, and we pray for His continued work in the lives of those we reached.
